Pet Resource Specials for March 2022

Now through March 31st | TESTICLE FESTIVAL | Spay and Neuter Solutions | You can apply for spay/neuter certificates for just \$5.00 co-pay on Spay and Neuter Solutions' [website](#) and clicking on "Apply for Help" under "Services." Pets must be owned. Not valid for rescue groups. Larger co-payments appreciated, the more money, the more animals can be altered.

Asavet Free or Low-Cost Spay & Neuter Clinics:

- **March 2nd** | Three Points Fire Station 303 | Check-in at 8:00 am
| Free spay/neuter and optional low-cost vaccines
- **March 9th** | The Animal League of Green Valley | Check-in is from 8:00 - 8:30 am
| \$40 copay per spay/neuter and optional low-cost vaccines

For ALL ASAVET spay/neuter events:

- No food after 12AM (the morning of surgery)
- Pets under 5mo of age do not need to be fasted
- All dogs must be on a leash or in a pet carrier
- All cats must be in a pet carrier
- All pets must be a minimum of 2 months old and weigh 2 pounds
- No appointments, only 1st come 1st serve

DETAILS FOR THE MARCH 2ND EVENT

ASAVET FREE Spay/Neuter in Three Points on February 2nd (typically first Wednesday of every month)

Not available to residents of Marana, Sahuarita or Green Valley. Otherwise, all of Pima County, Three Points preferred. 2 pets per household maximum. Check in at 8am. Sign in at the check-in table and remain in your vehicle with the window open to hear your name called. Park on the south side of the building. Do not disturb the Fire Station. Masks required. Optional vaccines (only with surgery): DAPP/PRC \$20 and rabies \$15. E collar required on male dogs months and older \$10. Limited to approximately 35 pets. Sponsored by the Pet Plate Fund.

DETAILS FOR MARCH 9TH EVENT

ASAVET LOW COST Spay/Neuter at The Animal League of Green Valley on February 9th (typically 2nd Wednesday of every month)

Masks required. Sign in, get paperwork and remain in the car until called. One person per animal allowed in the building. \$40 co-pay required for surgery and DAPP/PRC and rabies vaccines are included if needed. Limited to 30 surgeries

TNR Services:

- **Monday - Friday all month** | Santa Cruz Veterinary Clinic | 5408 S 12th Ave | Free Community Cat Trap Neuter Return spay/neuter | Check in is from 9:00 am - 11:00 a.m. Blackout dates (No TNR Drop Offs): March 4th, 8th, 9th, 15th, 22nd, and 29th
- **Snip N Tip at Pima Animal Care Center** | 4000 N Silverbell Rd
 - **From March 18th at 3 pm to March 20th at 12 pm** (see full details for drop off times)
 - Free spay and neuter for community cats (cats who live outdoors) in Pima County
 - Bring in carriers or traps (which are available for borrowing, see details)
 - Sign up online for reserving a space and approximate date of drop off. You will be notified at that time when to pick up.

DETAILS FOR SNIP N TIP

Pima Animal Care Center is holding a free spay and neuter event called Snip 'N' Tip for community cats March 18-20 in PACC's Multi-Purpose Room, 4000 North Silverbell Road.

Community cats are cats that prefer to live outdoors. The event is part of PACC's expanded Community Cat Trap-Neuter-Return Program (TNR). TNR is the humane and effective way to reduce the number of cats living on the streets in Pima County. It improves the overall health of the cats and prevents future generations of kittens from being born outside.

The event is only for outdoor community cats and kittens living in Pima County. Kittens should weigh at least 1.5 pounds and have a committed caretaker to monitor them after

surgery. Anyone can participate by bringing in an outdoor cat in a secure cat carrier or trap. People who bring cats will be responsible for returning them back to their neighborhood.

By bringing in cats, people can support a participating 501c3 shelter, rescue, or TNR organization. These non-profit partners will receive \$10 per cat and will be eligible for additional prizes. Incentives have been generously provided through donations.

If people need a trap or carrier, they can contact PACC's Community Cat Program by emailing communitycats@pima.gov. They can sign up for the event at app.waitwhile.com/book/snipntip.

All cats will receive:

- Brief exam by licensed veterinarian
- FVRCP (Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia) vaccines
- Rabies vaccines
- Parasite treatment as needed
- Minor medical care as needed
- Microchip implantation
- An eartip (humanely conducted under anesthesia)
- Female cats will also receive a green tattoo next to spay site (humanely conducted under anesthesia)

Drop-off hours are:

- Friday, March 18, 3 to 6 p.m.
- Saturday, March 19, 7 a.m. to noon
- Saturday, March 19, 3 to 6 p.m.
- Sunday, March 20, 7 a.m. to noon

When signing up through the link, trappers will be notified when the cats are ready for pick up.
