The Local News Initiative of Southern Arizona

The Community Foundation for Southern Arizona (CFSA) is excited to announce the launch of a new initiative to support local reporting and community access to local news and information through fundraising, grants, and a public awareness campaign.

Led by a group of local civic leaders and anchored at CFSA, the Local News Initiative of Southern Arizona will raise local and national philanthropic dollars to help increase and strengthen local news coverage for the people of Tucson, Pima County, and across Southern Arizona.

Through the first round of grants, \$225,000 has been awarded to six organizations supporting local news throughout Southern Arizona. The inaugural grant recipients include Arizona Luminaria, KAWC, Nogales International, Patagonia Regional Times, Tucson Agenda, and Tucson Sentinel.

On Thursday, April 25, 2024, CFSA welcomed over 250 community members to the Community Foundation Campus for our 2024 Community Celebration. Many thanks to everyone who joined us to celebrate Southern Arizona's vital nonprofits, impactful philanthropists, and dedicated community partners.

Adia Evans was awarded the **Igor Gorin Memorial Award**. This is the largest award for emerging opera singers in the United States. The award honors the legacy of Igor Gorin, an international opera star who fled oppression in his home country to find success in the United States and Tucson.

Carlos Ramirez and the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Southern Arizona were awarded the Diane Lynn Anderson Memorial Award. This award honors individuals in Southern Arizona who exemplify the same qualities that Diane Lynn Anderson possessed: active acceptance, respect, compassion, devotion, and caring for people with disabilities.

The Community Investment Corporation was awarded the Vital Nonprofit Bloom Award. This award recognizes a nonprofit organization in Southern Arizona that has made an exceptional contribution towards creating a vibrant and equitable community for all Southern Arizonans.

Wendy McBroom was awarded the **Bold Aspirations Bloom Award.** This award recognizes an individual, group, or organization whose bold aspirations, activities, and commitment have made a significant contribution toward creating a thriving Southern Arizona and embodies CFSA's value of Community.

John Amoroso was awarded the **Impactful Philanthropy Bloom Award**. This award recognizes an individual or group whose philanthropy embodies CFSA's values of Generosity and Trust and has contributed to the creation of a vibrant and equitable community for all Southern Arizonans.

Nonprofit Solar Project

At the Community Foundation for Southern Arizona, we are committed to reducing two of the most significant barriers to a vibrant Southern Arizona – environmental risks and inequity. This year, CFSA's Environmental Sustainability Impact Fund and Nonprofit Solar Project directly connected nonprofit organizations with solar technology that saves them dollars and reduces their environmental impact.

The Nonprofit Solar Project launched in 2022 to help local community service organizations meet a significant portion of their energy needs through solar power. Funded primarily by an anonymous donor, the project also received generous support from other partners such as Tucson Foundations, Tucson Electric Power, Wells Fargo, and other CFSA donors.

In the last two months, we have celebrated the completion of two solar projects at Edge High School and The Drawing Studio. Two additional projects are nearing completion and will be announced soon. The impact of a dedicated solar array installation for our grantees and community is twofold: it reduces the grantee's energy costs and carbon footprint, and those funds can then be reinvested into programming and infrastructure.

The completion of the solar installation at The Drawing Studio and Edge High School is an excellent example of what can be accomplished when individuals, businesses, and nonprofits come together to create a better – and more sustainable – Southern Arizona.



Edge High School

Edge is an AdvancED accredited, tuition free, charter high school. Edge offers both text and web based curriculum to meet the needs of students with diverse learning styles. Edge students enjoy small class sizes with a high level of individualized instruction. Students at Edge focus on three academic classes at a time and receive instruction from Highly Qualified and certified teachers.



The Community Foundation for Southern Arizona (CFSA) is proud to expand its efforts to provide unrestricted operating grants to local nonprofits with the launch of the Comunidad (Community) Grants Program. This grants program was created to provide unrestricted funding to Southern Arizona nonprofits with annual operating budgets under \$100,000.

Comunidad Grants support organizations working at the local level with their communities to address emerging or systemic issues. The program is dedicated to supporting grassroots nonprofits who are often most in need of unrestricted funding.

CORE Grants provide flexibility for organizations to use dollars as they see fit to address emerging issues, boost salaries and benefits, invest in technology and infrastructure, and build communication and fundraising strategies, all leading to a healthier, innovative, and robust organization.

CORE grants are rooted in mutual trust with the philosophy that organizations understand their unique needs and can demonstrate and achieve impact. CORE Grantees represent CORE characteristics including community, organizational sustainability, results, and effective programs.






